

Do you worry about a loved one who wanders?

The **Cape Elizabeth Police Department** is developing a new database to serve individuals with Alzheimer's, Dementia, Autism, and/or Developmental disabilities that can make them prone to wander. The Database provides a critical network of real time information including a photograph to Law Enforcement, which assists in locating individuals. To participate, you must register your loved one.

Registration is simple and takes just a few minutes.

- Photos of the individual allow officers to more easily identify him or her if they do get lost.
- Saves valuable time when seconds count.
- Alerts officers to potential triggers and ways to calm the individual.
- Enables family members or caregivers to be notified promptly when the person has been found.
- Information is secure and private
