## **Multi-user Mantras**

- •Volunteer help with downed trees appreciated. We had a quite a storm where a combination of ice and wind took down many trees. While vegetation removal on town open space requires permission of the Town (See Conservation Ordinance, Sec. 18-5-4), there is an explicit exemption that allows removal of trees that block town trails. We have had at least one inquiry from a resident offering to help clear trees on the trail, to which we enthusiastically accepted. If you find a tree down on the trail and are willing to clear the portion blocking the trail, please do so with our thanks.
- •Rogue trail closures. Public trails are often adjacent to private property and are laid out to respect property boundaries. When trail users create or use unmarked trails, they are often trespassing. If you find a trail has been blocked, please do NOT remove the barriers. This trail has usually been closed for a reason. Please stay on the trails that have been signed, for example with the G sign shown above. Our ability to retain and expand the Greenbelt Trail network is dependent on respecting the private property abutting our open space.
- •Muddy Trails. Looks like mud season is here. Think about using trails with better surface trail conditions, such as in Fort Williams, local beaches, and portions of the Great Pond Trail.
