Dear Chris,

This weekend there was quite a social media discussion of the current school building conditions including “vermin, mold and toxic lead contamination.” One poster claimed that Superintendent Record, “clarified that mold, lead in water, and vermin are ongoing issues.” Given the extraordinary damp conditions over the summer, I am not at all surprised that there might have been a few mold issues that would have required remediation. That happens, particularly in coastal communities. My own house had mold problems from this summer’s weather, it doesn’t mean I tear the house down. I trust that as responsible educators that timely remediation occurred.

Please consider this a FOAA request to you and the SBAC for information regarding the current facility conditions and remediation actions taken within the last 2 years regarding mold, vermin and lead contaminated water. It is incomprehensible to think that the administration would allow these conditions as “ongoing” issues. Please include internal communication within the school administration, as well as communication to the parents and faculty.

I am happy to come in and exam the documents to avoid an exorbitant copying charges. This community needs an honest assessment and discussion of these conditions.
