Hello to all SBAC members and thank you all for the time and energy you've put into this important project. I reviewed the Public Comments that were made available for last night's forum and wanted to highlight a significant point. I tallied expressions of support for each option individually, for "A-D", for "E-G", and those who "Need More Info" (I included in this group those who expressed did not ask for more info but also expressed no specific opinion)(those who expressed a 1st choice then 2nd, etc, I included under their 1st choice).

Results: A=4, B=5, C=5, D=3, E=14, F=0, G=113, A-D=1, E-G=37, More Info=24.

This is not scientific, of course, but it does demonstrate that there is VERY strong community support for investing now in both new middle and elementary schools. There is talk on the completely reliable (!) social media that the SBAC has at least informally taken Option G off the table. Given the overwhelming support demonstrated by the public comments, this would be a very serious mistake. Please listen to your constituents and keep Option G on the table!
