I hope this email finds you well. My name is Ben Bornstein and I live off of Spurwink Road.

Thank you so much for the tireless work you've put into the school project. As you meet this week to decide on which proposal to push forward, I strongly encourage you to pick Option E, for the following reasons:

- Option E is the most financially responsible choice – we will pay less as taxpayers in the long term. For Cape residents on a fixed budget, this is imperative.
- Option E sets the town on the path of creating a master plan, something that will benefit residents today and far into the future.
- Option E has the least amount of student disruption.
- The cost difference between C and E is minimal, but with E we get a chance to 'restart the clock' through a new school.
- Option E creates a safe, long-term solution for the issues that have plagued our town for more than 3 decades.
