My name is Elly and I live in Oakhurst.

Thank you so much for the tireless work you've put into the school project. As you meet this week to decide on which proposal to push forward, I strongly encourage you to pick Option E.

- Option E is the most financially responsible choice – we will pay less as taxpayers in the long term. For Cape residents on fixed budget, this is imperative.
