My name is Jocie Dickson and I live in Shore Acres / Trundy Point.

Thank you so much for the tireless work you've put into the school project. As you meet this week to decide on which proposal to push forward, **I strongly encourage you to pick Concept E.**

- Concept E is the most financially responsible choice – we will pay less as taxpayers in the long term. For Cape residents on fixed budget, this is imperative.
- Concept E sets the town on the path of creating a master plan, something that will benefit residents today and far into the future.
- Concept E has the least amount of student disruption. As a parent of a rising kindergartener (and a 1.5 year old, who will eventually enter the school system) this is important to me and other parents of current students.
- The cost difference between C and E is minimal, but with E we get a chance to 'restart the clock' through a new school.
