[CE SBAC] school building proposals—support for Option E

Hello.

I am writing to express my support for Option E among the school building proposals.

Option E gets Cape a new MS which will last 60+ years, and sets Cape up to only have to rebuild ES and/or HS in 10-20 years, instead of all three schools.

For a median value home in Cape (currently \$700,000), the additional tax cost for E would be \$102 a month/\$3.65 per day. For Option B, which is the cheapest option and renovation/addition only, the cost is \$69 per month/\$2.47 per day. The difference between E and B is \$1.18 per day.

While the up front cost is the greatest, E is the most fiscally responsible for the town because of the long-term return on investment. (The other two options, B and C, are renovation/addition only and will need to be fixed/replaced again in 10-20 years.)

Don't repeat past mistakes. Cape could have had two new schools in 1993 for \$16-18 million, but the school building committee at the time said it was "too costly."

Don't ask voters to come back in 10-20 years for double the amount. (The referendum in 2022 was \$116 million and Cape got two schools. Just two years later, \$114 million only gets us one new school. Who knows the cost in 10 years.)

The needs have been made clear by Harriman in its extensive report.
