
Pollack Brook Burial Ground

This colonial burial ground, with approximately [35] markers, most likely includes the remains of multiple generations of the Nathaniel Jordan family. It was common practice at the time to mark a burial site with an unmarked slate rock, although markings on soft slate exposed to the elements can wear away. One existing marker includes an inscription of "_794, 4 mths," which helps date the burial ground.

Nathaniel Jordan 5th (1766-1853) married Mary Jordan in 1793. There is a record of at least 10 children born through 1820. In 1827, Nathaniel Jordan 5th and Catherine Jordan (married in 1806) sold the land, referencing in the deed "except one rod square where my children are buried."

The area is permanently preserved with conservation easements held by the US
