

Report of the FWPC: March 15, 2018

FWPF Board Highlights:

- Work continues on the Garden Tour.
- The Cliff Walk Landscape presentation was removed from the agenda for the Town Council workshop last week. We had not realized they expected materials from us in advance of the workshop. The presentation has been rescheduled for a workshop in April followed by presentation during the regular meeting of the Town Council on June 11. Our goal is to obtain approval from the Council for the entire project, with the understanding that each year the Park Committee will review the work planned and the funds available to accomplish that work.
- The Foundation will have a table at the Portland Flower Show 3/21-3/24. We will be
 explaining the work of the Foundation and encouraging volunteers to sign up to help us
 with that work.
- With the help of Coastal Maine Aquatics swim club and Cape Elizabeth Boy Scouts, we worked with Todd Robbins to remove winter moth bands from trees at the Park last weekend.
- Our Education Committee will again work with Cape Elizabeth 2nd graders to plant seedlings and plant plugs on the slope above the stone seating circle at the Children's Garden.
- The Education Committee will again sponsor a Maine Audubon bird walk at the Park this spring.
- We have received a grant to bring "underserved" children to the Park. The Education Committee is coordinating with a teacher at the Riverton School in Portland to bring students to the Park for a few hours this spring.
