Dear Ms. Lane and members of the Board of Trustees,

I am writing this letter on behalf of myself and the children of my late husband, John Philbrick, including John Philbrick, Jr., Katherine Philbrick Vorenberg, Louise Philbrick, Stacey Philbrick Yadav, and Natalia Philbrick. We are collectively petitioning the Town of Cape Elizabeth to allow the cremains of John Winthrop Philbrick, Sr., to be interred at the Riverside Cemetery, where other members of our family have been buried, and that provision be made for my own interment alongside him when the time arises. As his widow, I understand that this letter should come from me, but it comes at the request of all six of us.

My husband, John, was born and raised in Cape Elizabeth, spent many years of his adulthood there, and had ties to the community particularly through his brother Donald and Donald's family, who are buried at Riverside, and through their mother, Ruth Lockey Philbrick (1899-2000) who lived at 21 Oakhurst Road in Cape Elizabeth for seven decades. While John himself may not immediately fit the residency requirement for burial at Riverside, we hope that you will appreciate his deep ties to Cape Elizabeth and understand that it is difficult for his adult children, in particular, to imagine him anywhere else.

The youngest child of Donald Philbrick and Ruth Lockey Philbrick, John was born in 1937, and lived in the house at 21 Oakhurst Road that Donald had built in 1929. John, his sister Jean (Philbrick) Strout, and brother Donald were all raised in this home and remained there through their respective marriages. Both of John's parents lived in Cape Elizabeth from 1929 until the time of their deaths. In the case of Ruth Lockey Philbrick, this period extended until her death at the age of 100. John's family was heavily involved in community affairs in Cape Elizabeth. His father served on the Cape Elizabeth draft board during the Second World War, and his elder brother Donald served as a selectment and town meeting moderator. Donald and his wife,

Janet Poole Philbrick, as well as our nephews Buddy and David Poole, have all been buried at Riverside, and our aunt Margot, Donald's first wife, continues to live in Cape Elizabeth.

After graduating from Cape Elizabeth High School and Bowdoin College, John continued to live at the family's Oakhurst Rd. home until his marriage. While a law student at Harvard, he and his first wife Margaret Davidson Philbrick returned to Oakhurst during the summers while John clerked at Verrill, Dana, Philbrick, and Whitehouse LLP. After graduation, he joined the firm and they purchased a home on Warren Avenue in Cape Elizabeth and lived here until 1967. Following their separation, he returned to live on Shore Road in 1980, and remained there until relocating to live with me in 1983. Even after leaving the Cape for Saco and later Portland, however, John's ties to his mother, brother, and brother's family kept Cape Elizabeth close to John's heart, and all of us recall spending holidays and many weekends with our large Philbrick family, at Oakhurst or on family outings to the beach. Despite the fact that John, Katie, Louise, Stacey, and Natasha John's children from different marriages and through adoption, their individual and collective memories of their father, and my memories of him with them, are firmly anchored in Cape Elizabeth, which forms an ineluctable part of the landscape of their youth, and is the place they all most clearly associate with "family." We urge you to approve this petition for the interment of my husband John's cremains, and mine with him when the time comes, at Riverside Cemetery.
