Public Hearing and Consideration of Adoption of the Annual Municipal, School and County Budget

Chairman Carson opened the public hearing at 7:47PM. After hearing no comments, the public hearing was closed.

Intro – Manager McGovern

The recommended tax increase is .44 per or 2.23%. The State has confirmed the Town will receive the state subsidy at the same level as last year. However the Town will lose approximately \$45,000 from the circuit breaker program for the Portland Arts and Technology School.

Ordered, the Cape Elizabeth Town Council, having held a public hearing on Monday, May 8, 2000, does hereby adopt the Municipal Budget for Fiscal Year 2001 with gross expenditures of \$21,446,298 and gross revenues of \$6,971,781 and with the amount of **\$14,474,517** to be raised from taxation, and does further fix Tuesday, October 3, 2000, and Tuesday, April 3, 2001, as the dates upon each of which one-half of such tax is due and payable, with interest to accrue upon taxes due and unpaid after each such date at the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum. In accordance with 36 M.R.S.A. Section 506, the Tax Collector and Town Treasurer are authorized to accept prepayment of taxes not yet committed or prior to any due date and pay no interest thereon. In accordance with 36 M.R.S.A. Section 506-A, a taxpayer who pays an amount in excess of that finally assessed shall be repaid the amount of overpayment plus interest from the date of overpayment at the annual rate of 6.0% annum.

If the Town receives an additional \$45,000(+/-) for the Portland Arts and Technology School prior to the Assessor setting the tax rate, this amount shall reduce the amount that would have been otherwise set for the tax rate.
