## Item #34-00-01

Chairman Carson asked Asher Kramer and Patricia Wasserman to explain the two points of view regarding this issue. This is not a public hearing.

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Asher Kramer, 4 Ledgewood Lane

Mr. Kramer explained he is presenting the petition on behalf the petitioners. A total of 146 signatures were collected. The issues are:

- A single access creates volume and speed public safety issues.
- An emergency access doesn't allow the same access as a road built to standards. The original plan wasn't intended as such.
- Town ordinances would suggest another access.
- The neighbors are negatively impacted. The petitioners request a change to the zoning regulations.
- The petitioners don't believe this is a "dead issue." They request the Town Council to reconsider and defer to the environmental impact to the Planning Board.

Patricia Wasserman, 3 Running Tide Road– Ms Wasserman stated she is sympathetic to issues of speed and volume. Safety is important. The issue of speed in the neighborhood should be addressed, no matter if this access issue is opened or not. There is not "one quick fix." The impact of other neighborhoods, e.g. Two Lights, Shore Acres, should be considered. Have the petitioners thought of these issues? The DEP ruling in 1996 stated the access should be gravel. What is the environmental impact on the neighborhoods?

Councilor Watson requested the Town Council to consider her voting on this issue, as she resides at 7 Winding Way.

<u>Moved by Councilor Swift-Kayatta and Seconded by Councilor Roberts</u> Ordered the Cape Elizabeth Town Council requests Councilor Watson to abstain from discussion and voting on this issue due to a potential perceived financial interest.
