Council Meeting # 14 of September 10, 2007

MOTION: C. Dill

SECOND: A. Swift-Kayatta Vote: 7 in favor – 0 opposed.

Reports and Correspondence

Chairman McKenney recognized and congratulated Councilor Swift-Kayatta for having been recently elected President of the Maine Municipal Association (MMA)

Councilor Swift-Kayatta thanked Mr. McGovern for his help and support over many years.

Councilor Rowe spoke on the goals of the newly formed Cape Elizabeth Farm Committee and announced their plan to meet formally on November 14 at Sprague Hall at 7:00 pm. All are encouraged and invited to attend.

Councilor Rowe assessed the goals of the recently formed Fire Department Strategic Planning Committee. Their next meeting is tentatively scheduled for October 25th.

Lastly, Councilor Rowe thanked Police Capt. Brent Sinclair for having organized a town employee golf tournament at the Purpoodock Club. He thanked his team all of whom enjoyed participating in the event and celebrating their victorious outcome.

Councilor Lynch reported that the Cumberland County Budget Advisory Committee is seeing more increases projected for the upcoming year, possibly as much as 10% over last year. She cited the County jail as having been deemed one of the most expensive facilities in the Nation and she is seeking answers as to why this is.

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Councilor Dill responded by announcing she will be attending a Criminal Justice Summit in Augusta on October 30th and hopes this opportunity will allow her to obtain additional information on this matter.

Chairman McKenney announced he was informed this evening that the Cape Elizabeth School System received notification today that they will retain their independent status. He thanked all the Councilors and Representative Cynthia Dill for their contributing efforts and involvement in this making this happen.

Councilor Swift-Kayatta echoed her praise for Representative Dill as well and thanked her for her efforts in making all this possible for the Town and her continued vigilance going forward.

Councilor Dill announced there will be a meeting of the Design Workshop scheduled for October 27th from 8:00 am to noon at Town Hall to discuss the intersection of Shore Road and Route 77. The public is encouraged and invited to attend.

Town Manager's Report

On the subject of the School notification, Mr. McGovern explained that the audit report turned up that 3.1% per pupil expenditures were less than the 4% per pupil expenditure requirement for system administration.

The Shore Road paving project has resumed as well, the traffic light project at the High School is progressing but the installation of the actual light fixture is delayed until early November.

Public Safety was acknowledged and thanked for their response to the gas leak which occurred over the weekend. Chief McGouldrick will be meeting with the PUC to communicate ongoing concerns with a hope to see an improvement in the responsiveness of Northern Utilities operations.

David Weatherbie and Joan Benoit Samuelson, representing the Beach to Beacon Board of Directors, presented a \$5000 donation to Fort Williams Park in recognition and thanks to the residents and the Town for supporting this road race and event for the past 10 years.
