Subject: 35 mph Spurwink Ave. speed limit

Spurwink Avenue is the only remaining road in the Cape (except for Route 77 and a few hundred yards of Scott Dyer Road) with a 35 mph speed limit. Over the years other roads formerly having 35 mph limits have had their limits reduced to 30 mph and in some cases to 25 mph. Based on the amount of traffic and the fact that Spurwink is otherwise no different from the roads having 30 mph limits, we ask that the Council consider reducing the limit on Spurwink (and Scott Dyer as well) to 30 mph.
