8	SEC. 21-1-1 Purpose
9	
10	The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the public health, safety and welfare by
11	providing for signage to direct safe and orderly traffic movement. Signs shall be
12 13	allowed to express the First Amendment right to free speech, and to promote local businesses and events. Signs shall be regulated in a content neutral manner to preserve
14	community character and aesthetics.

17	and community aesthetics to signage.

19	SEC. 21-1-2 Definitions
20	
21	<b>Banner:</b> A sign on a textile or plastic material, which is secured, to a pole or structure in
22 23	a fashion, which may allow movement by the atmosphere.
23 24	<b>Freestanding sign:</b> A sign in a fixed location supported by structure, supports, or the
25	ground and not attached to or dependent for support upon any building.

27	<b>Permanent Sign:</b> A sign erected for a period of more than 8 weeks in a calendar year.
28	
29	<b>Permanent window display:</b> A sign attached to, placed upon or painted on the interior
30	of a window or door of a building, which is intended for viewing from the exterior of a
31	building.
32 33	Private Traffic Control Sign: Any sign, permanent or temporary, erected on private
34	property for the sole purpose of providing direction regarding entrances and exits,
35	parking and direction to facilities on the property to visitors.

37	<b>Projecting or suspending sign:</b> A sign fixed at an angle or perpendicular to the wall of
38	any building in such a manner as to read perpendicular or at an angle to the wall on
39	which it is mounted.

41 42 43	<b>Property Address sign:</b> A sign located on private property depicting the property address information and erected in a manner to aid in traffic control and promotion of public safety during an emergency. A sign indicating the name of a neighborhood

erected in a manner to aid in traffic control and promotion of public safety during an emergency may also be a property address sign.

**Road Right-of-way:** A strip of land acquired by conveyance, reservation, dedication, forced dedication, prescription or condemnation and intended to be occupied by a road.

**Roof sign:** Any sign where more than 50% of the surface area extends directly above the roof or parapet line of a building.

**Sign:** Any structure, display, logo, device or representation which is designed or used to advertise or call attention to any item, business activity or place, or is an expression of free speech, and is visible from outside a building. It does not include the flag, pennant or insignia of any nation, state or town.

Note: There may be a problem with the last sentence.

**Sign area:** The entire area of a sign with a single continuous perimeter enclosing the extreme limits of the sign surface. For a sign painted on or applied to a structure, the area shall include any background of a different color than the color or finish of the structure. For a sign consisting of individual letters or symbols without a distinguishable background, the area shall be that of the smallest rectangle which encompasses all of the letters and symbols. Total sign area shall be the aggregate of all exposed faces. Dimensions of signs shall not include supporting structures but shall include any frames.

**Sign Height:** The distance from the average grade of the land beneath the sign to the top of the sign.

**Temporary Sign:** Any sign erected for a period of 8 weeks or less in a calendar year. For the purpose of measuring length of time a temporary sign is displayed, use of a sign for any length of time in a 24-hour period shall constitute 1 day.

**Traffic Control Sign:** Any sign, permanent or temporary, erected within the public right of way or on municipal property for the purpose of providing direction or information (wayfinding) to citizens and visitors.

**Visible:** Any sign capable of being seen without visual aid by a person of normal visual acuity *who is not located on the property where the sign is located*.

Note: italics is new.

Wall Sign: Any sign affixed to a wall or printed on a wall in such a manner as to readparallel to the wall on which it is mounted, but shall also include awnings and canopies.

Note: Definitions not imported to this draft at this time are advertising sign, agricultural operations, internal illumination, message board sign, off-premises sign, on-premises sign, open flag, public way, sandwich board sign, shopping center.

## SEC. 21-2-1 Location

Signs shall be related by location in which the sign is installed.

**A. Town wide signage.** The following signs shall be permitted throughout the Town and shall not require a permit. Upon request of the Code Enforcement Officer, a property owner shall provide an inventory of the number and square footage of signs erected on the property.

Note: WHO, WHERE, HOW MUCH, PERMIT

 1. Traffic Control sign. The Town of Cape Elizabeth and the Maine Department of Transportation may erect any traffic control sign within the right-of-way of any public road or public property. This signage shall be in conformance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) standards to the maximum extent feasible.

Note: For this type of sign, no limit on the size of the sign or the total sq. ft. of signage allowed is proposed.

2. Private Traffic Control sign. Any private property owner may erect upon his/her property traffic control signage. No sign shall exceed 6 sq. ft. per side and no more than a total of 24 sq. ft. of permanent private traffic control signage shall be allowed.

3. Property address sign. Any property owner may erect upon his/her property a sign indicating the street address of the property. No sign shall exceed 6 sq. ft. per side and no more than a total of 12 sq. ft. of signage shall be allowed.

A property address sign may also be erected indicating the name of a neighborhood. The sign may be erected within the road right-of-way with the permission of the town or within a private road right-of-way with the permission of the owner of the private right-of-way. No sign shall exceed 36 sq. ft. per side and no more than a total of 72 sq. ft.

**B. Residential and non-commercial zone signage.** The following signs may be allowed after issuance of a permit from the Code Enforcement Officer in the

Residence A, Residence B, Residence C, and all other noncommercial districts, and as further defined by street frontage. For properties with frontage on more than 1 street, the amount of signage per street may be allowed as provided for below.

1. Property with frontage on an Arterial, Collector or Rural Connector Road (Appendix B, Zoning Ordinance). In addition to the Townwide signage allowed in Sec. 21-2-1.A, a sign may be erected on a property located in a residential or non-commercial zoning district and upon which permitted non-residential uses are occurring. No sign shall exceed 32 sq. ft. per side and no more than a total of 32 sq. ft.

Note: For example, a wall sign may be 32 sq. ft. in size, but a 2-sided ground sign may not be more than 16 sq. ft. per side. This reduces the size of church signage from 72 sq. ft. to 32 sq. ft.

 2. Property with frontage on a Feeder, Local or Private Rd (Appendix B, Zoning Ordinance). In addition to the Townwide signage allowed in Sec. 21-2-1.A, a sign may be erected on a property located in a residential or non-commercial zoning district and upon which permitted non-residential uses are occurring. No sign shall exceed 12 sq. ft. per side and no more than a total of 12 sq. ft.

C. Business zone signage. The following signage may be allowed after issuance of a permit from the Code Enforcement Officer in the Town Center District, Business A District, Business B District and Business C District.

1. Permanent Signs. Permanent signage may be erected on a property located in the Town Center, Business A, Business B and Business C Districts. Excluding the Town wide signage allowed in Sec. 21-2-1.A, permanent signage on the property shall not exceed a total of 75 sq. ft. Individual sign square footage shall comply with the following table and proposed signs shall be assigned the most applicable sign type category by the Code Enforcement Officer.

**D. Temporary Signage.** Temporary signs shall be allowed by their location adjacent to roadways.

 Note: This section replaces the current sign provisions governing temporary civic sign, political sign, off-premise yard sale sign, open house real estate off premises sign, home occupation fish and farm market off premises sign, off premises pick your own sign, sandwich board signs, and open flags.

1. <u>Temporary signs adjacent to an Arterial, Collector or Rural Connector Road.</u> Within the right-of-way of an arterial, collector or rural connector

road, as classified in Appendix B of the Zoning Ordinance, a sign may be placed for a period not to exceed 8 weeks in a calendar year. No temporary sign shall exceed 8 sq. ft per side and no more than a total of 16 sq. ft. The maximum dimension of temporary sign shall not exceed 4 feet and the maximum sign height shall not exceed 3.5 ft. The name, address and phone number or email address and date the sign was placed shall appear on the sign.

On private property adjacent to an arterial, collector or rural connector road, as classified in Appendix B of the Zoning Ordinance, temporary signage may be erected on private property for a period not to exceed 8 weeks in a calendar year. No temporary sign shall exceed 6 sq. ft. per side and no more than a total of 12 sq. ft. The maximum dimension of a temporary sign shall not exceed 4 feet and the maximum sign height shall not exceed 3.5 ft.

Note: This section replaces on premises yard sale sign, real estate sign, home occupation fish and farm market home occupation, pick your own signs. This also reduces the size of a temporary residential development sign from 36 sq. ft to 12 sq. ft.

2. <u>Temporary signs adjacent to a Feeder, Local or Private Road.</u> Within the right-of-way of a feeder, local or private road, as classified in Appendix B of the Zoning Ordinance, a sign may be placed for a period not to exceed 8 weeks in a calendar year. No temporary sign shall exceed 8 sq. ft per side and no more than a total of 8 sq. ft. The maximum dimension of temporary sign shall not exceed 4 feet and the maximum sign height shall not exceed 3.5 ft. The name, address and phone number or email address and date the sign was placed shall appear on the sign.

On private property adjacent to a feeder, local or private road, as classified in Appendix B of the Zoning Ordinance, temporary signage may be erected on private property for a period not to exceed 8 weeks in a calendar year. No temporary sign shall exceed 6 sq. ft. per side and no more than a total of 12 sq. ft. The maximum dimension of a temporary sign shall not exceed 4 feet and the maximum sign height shall not exceed 3.5 ft.

Note: This section replaces on premises yard sale sign, real estate sign, home occupation fish and farm market home occupation, pick your own signs. This also reduces the size of a temporary residential development sign from 36 sq. ft to 12 sq. ft.

40	1.	Maintenance. All signs permitted under this ordinance shall be				
41		appropriately maintained. Appropriate maintenance consists of no				
42		missing lettering, no peeling paint, no cracked or broken glass or				
43		plastic, a solid foundation for fixed signs, all lighting being fully				

operational and no unsafe conditions. The Code Enforcement Officer shall determine if a sign is being appropriately maintained. If, in his/her judgment, a sign is not appropriately maintained, he/she shall give thirty days notice to have it repaired or removed. The owner of the sign shall have the option to repair or remove the sign. Anyone not complying with the order of the Code Enforcement Officer may be subject to a fine as provided in Section 21-6-1.

## 2. <u>Structural stability to protect public safety.</u>

Note: not yet drafted, but should include elements of the following:

- (d) Illumination of signs from an external light source shall be shielded so as to prevent glare onto a public way or private properties. No sign shall be illuminated in a manner, which creates a public hazard by adversely impacting the movement of people and vehicles, and the enjoyment of adjacent properties. Lighting shall minimize glare and reflection and shall be of an intensity and brightness in keeping with the general lighting level of the area. Hours of illumination may be limited to reduce adverse impact on adjacent properties and to conserve energy resources.
- (e) A freestanding sign shall not impair a driver's normal sight distance nor be placed within 30 feet of a crosswalk.
- (f) All signs shall be designed and constructed in compliance with the most current applicable sections of the IBC/IRC Code.
- 5. The sandwich board sign shall be weighed or secured to avoid being carried away.

## Sec. 21-5-1 Nonconformance

- 1. Any temporary sign erected after the effective date of this ordinance that is not in compliance with this ordinance may be removed by the Code Enforcement Officer or a designee.
- 2. Any permanent sign erected after the effective date of this ordinance that is not in compliance with this ordinance shall be ordered removed by the Code Enforcement Officer with notice of seven business days.

1 2 3		3. Any temporary sign in place at the time of enactment of this ordinance that is not in conformance with the standards of this ordinance shall be removed by the owner on the effective date of
4		this ordinance.
5		
6		4. Any permanent sign not conforming with the standards of this
7		ordinance may be replaced with a permit from the Code
8		Enforcement Officer and with documentation of the size of the
9		nonconforming sign.

11		5. Any sign that poses an immediate hazard to public safety may be
12		removed by any authorized municipal agent.
13		
14		Note: Item 1, 2, 3, and 5 are the existing provisions and need review.

18	A.	Enforcement/Penalties. Any person, or entity owning, occupying, or
19		having the control and the use of, any building, land, sign or part thereof,
20		who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be punished by
21		a fine of not less than \$50.00 and not more than \$100.00. Each day such
22		violation is permitted to exist after notification thereof by the Code
23		Enforcement Officer shall constitute a separate offense.

25	В.	Substitution. A non-commercial sign may be substituted for any permitted
26		sign, except as provided in Sec. 21-2-1.A.

28	C.	Severability. Should any section or provision of this Ordinance be
29		declared by the courts to be invalid, such decision shall not invalidate any
