

Q1 Are you a year-round resident of Cape Elizabeth?







- It's one of the main reasons my family moved to Maine from NYC; nature, ocean, hiking and being able to access these things.


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Q5 How often do you access/visit the Cape Elizabeth shore during the months of June, July, and August?







Q8 Which public access points do you use (Rank by frequency with 1 being most frequent)?






Please tell us how the Town of Cape Elizabeth can improve public access to the shore and waters?

- I access the ocean at the south end of Crescent beach and I have to pay \$25 to do so. I understand that starting next year in order to use Kettle Cove a fee will need to be



Q12 Please tell us a little about yourself - Age




