RE: Petition for Ordinance

Dear Ms. Lane:

On behalf of the Save Our Shoreline Access Coalition (“SOS”), a unincorporated association of citizens organized to foster protection of Cape Elizabeth’s public access rights to shoreland resources, I have enclosed petitions signed by 911 separate registered voters requesting enactment of an ordinance pursuant to Town Charter Article VIII, Section 3. The ordinance adds a new Article 7, Section 18-7-1, to the existing Conservation Ordinance, requiring that any disposition of Town real estate providing direct or indirect access to shoreland areas, whose retention has been recommended by an authorized Town committee, would require a vote of at least five Town Council Members or approval by a public referendum. The ordinance enacts a safeguard against the Town Council releasing public rights to shoreline resources by a bare majority vote.

You earlier confirmed to SOS that the required number of signatures for a citizen-initiated ordinance petition is 837, being 10% of the registered voters as of the most recent gubernatorial election. SOS has been diligent in seeking only valid signatures, but has secured well more than the minimum in case your review finds any invalid signatures. *(Note: the enclosed petitions include 914 signatures, but there are three duplicate signatures in that total.)* Please let me know should you determine there is a shortfall, so that SOS can promptly obtain and submit any necessary additional signatures.

The impetus for SOS seeking this ordinance was the recent prospect of a litigation settlement releasing public rights in paper streets along the shore. The ordinance is drafted to apply more generally. It applies to any disposition of Town real estate that may facilitate public shoreline access, including matters pending at the time of this filing. On the other hand, the ordinance respects the role of Town citizenry in identifying and protecting those public resources through the work of the Conservation Committee, Fort Williams Committee, Comprehensive Plan Committee, Planning Board or other Town

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Council-appointed committees. Its applicability is limited to only those Town property rights identified and recommended for retention by such committees.

The ordinance was crafted by SOS not to hamstring the Town Council's other business or impose significant costs on the Town. It does not require unanimity for Town Council actions disposing of shore access real estate nor does it require a public referendum on each such disposition. But the ordinance instead does reflect the public's interest in achieving a higher level of scrutiny by the Town Council and a greater consensus among those elected representatives when public access to shoreland is at stake. A five-vote requirement (or the alternative of public referendum) is a prudent safeguard to avoid the risk of unconsidered Town Council action. SOS is mindful that the Town's most treasured public amenity, Fort Williams, escaped being lost to private development by the vote of a single Town Councilor many years ago. The ordinance's supermajority requirement will cause future Town Councilors to reflect carefully upon the public's consistently held views of the importance of protecting public access to shoreland resources.

We understand that you must now validate the petition signatures, and that the Town Council must hold a public hearing within thirty (30) days, and within the following thirty (30) days set a date for a referendum vote. We also understand that the Charter provides for the Town's attorney to review the ordinance for legality, accuracy and clarity before being put out to referendum. As the principal hand in drafting the ordinance for SOS, I will be happy to cooperate with the Town's attorney's review.

SOS is hopeful that the Town Council recognizes the prudence and wisdom of this ordinance, and the overwhelming public support for its purposes. Throughout the Charter-mandated process, SOS intends to urge that the Town Council adopt the ordinance on its own and forego the need to send it out to a public vote.

PETITION FOR ENACTMENT OF ORDINANCE TO LIMIT DISPOSITION OF SHORELINE ACCESS REAL ESTATE

Statement of Purpose: Public shoreline access has always been vitally important to the citizens of Cape Elizabeth for the enjoyment of our precious, limited coastal resources. A proposed settlement agreement is under consideration that would release the Town's interest in portions of a shoreline paper street right of way on Surfside Avenue abutting the properties of five plaintiffs in an ongoing lawsuit against the Town. In exchange for removing any possibility of future public access to those portions of the paper street, the Town would receive \$500,000. Currently, the votes of four out of seven Town Council members could take this action, regardless of the recommendations of various Town-appointed boards and committees and the expressed wishes of interested Town residents. Consistent with the Comprehensive and Greenbelt Plans, and the recommendation of the Town Planning Board, the Town should retain its interest in any shoreline properties with actual or potential access for Town citizens. This ordinance is intended to prevent the Town Council from releasing the Town's rights to any shoreline access, including but not limited to fee simple ownership, easements, rights to accept paper streets, or historic use under common law, without a vote of at least five Town Council members, or a referendum of Town voters approving the release.





ORD. CHAPTER 18 CONSERVATION ORDINANCE IS HEREBY AMENDED BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE VII:

Article: VII: Disposition of Shoreland Access Real Estate

Sec. 18-7-1 Any sale, release or other disposition by the Town of real estate (whether held in fee, via easement, as incipient rights of dedication, or otherwise) providing direct or indirect access to shoreland areas and whose retention by the Town has been recommended by the Conservation Committee, Fort Williams Committee, Comprehensive Plan Committee, Planning Board, or other duly authorized committee appointed by the Town Council, shall not be sold, released or otherwise disposed of inconsistent with the recommendation of such committee or board except by a vote of at least five Town Council members, or following submission to a public referendum which approves such disposition.

Notwithstanding 1 M.R.S.A. §302, this provision shall apply to any proceeding involving the disposition of Town real estate not fully consummated prior to the filing of the petition for enactment of this Ordinance with the Town Clerk.









ORD. CHAPTER 18 CONSERVATION ORDINANCE IS HEREBY AMENDED BY ADDING A NEW ARTICLE VII:

Article: VII: Disposition of Shoreland Access Real Estate

Sec. 18-7-1 Any sale, release or other disposition by the Town of real estate (whether held in fee, via easement, as incipient rights of dedication, or otherwise) providing direct or indirect access to shoreland areas and whose retention by the Town has been recommended by the Conservation Committee, Fort Williams Committee, Comprehensive Plan Committee, Planning Board, or other duly authorized committee appointed by the Town Council, shall not be sold, released or otherwise disposed of inconsistent with the recommendation of such committee or board except by a vote of at least five Town Council members, or following submission to a public referendum which approves such disposition.

Notwithstanding 1 M.R.S.A. §302, this provision shall apply to any proceeding involving the disposition of Town real estate not fully consummated prior to the filing of the petition for enactment of this Ordinance with the Town Clerk.
