The following contains the minimum requirements for seasonal Out haul Moorings in sheltered waters. Boat Length 14 Feet and under Boat Weight Weight Block Weight Chain Size (Bottom) Chain Size (Top) 14' 1,500 lbs 75lbs 300 lbs 1/2" 3/8" Out Haul will consist of a heavy Block or other type floating weight, with at least a pickup buoy marking the block, with non-floating line to a point on shore staked out at the closet point to the high water mark., as not to obstruct foot traffic AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE. The Out Haul Mooring must also not impede navigation in the area. Reviewed on an individual Basis. For the safety of his/her boat and that of adjacent boats, mooring permit holders are responsible for having their mooring set and making any required adjustments or repairs. Boats must have been moored by July 1 of the permitted year or the mooring permit shall be revoked subject to the Harbormaster's discretion. The denied applicant may appeal the Harbormaster's decision (See Diagram)
